**Summary:** The Climate Change Adaptation Liaison will be responsible for selecting community members, especially Elders, who are knowledgeable about the land and interview them about their observations of weather-related changes and events using a list of questions and a consent form provided by the researchers.

**Duties:**

- Conduct interviews in the language chosen by the person being interviewed.
  - Interviews will normally be audio-recorded but the person being interviewed may choose not to be recorded. The content of the recordings will be the intellectual property of the person interviewed but ownership of the recording will normally be assigned by the participant to the Band.
  - Notes, in English, summarizing the answers, will be provided to the Laurentian University researchers by the interviewer;
  - Those who are interviewed will remain anonymous and known only to the interviewer, unless they choose to be identified and available for follow up questions from the researchers.
- Review drafts of the community's climate change impact study, contributing to its accuracy and completeness, and seeking supplementary information in the community about unusual or severe weather events and impacts, such as weather-related emergencies;
- Contribute to completing the climate change impact and risk matrix and assist in developing adaptation actions and plans designed to reduce the impacts of climate change on the First Nation;
- Facilitate community meetings where, for example, results of the project are presented, or when community involvement is required;
- Participate in the activities of a network of community-based "Climate Change Specialists" from Council communities, and from First Nation communities across the north;
- Participate in workshops and activities designed to increase knowledge and understanding of climate change and climate change impacts in the north;
- Monitor selected environmental indicators, using equipment provided, and document weather-related events affecting the community and community members in the homeland;
- Be a source of information, knowledge and understanding about climate change impacts in the past and potential impacts in the future, for the First Nation;



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- Facilitate and co-ordinate any specific projects related to understanding and monitoring climate change impacts in the traditional territories of the First Nation;
- Attend workshops and learning sessions to build personal technical and communication skills related to climate change;
- Contribute to the project website when it is established.

**Qualifications:**

- Completion of Grade 12 diploma/G.E. D or equivalent.
- Excellent communication skills, both verbal and written.
- Knowledge of computers and software applications such as Microsoft Office.
- Knowledge of Aboriginal culture, traditions, and way of life.
- Wabigoon Lake Ojibway Nation band member an asset.
