- Creating a website for Wabigoon Lake Ojibway Nation news, *by and for the people of Wabigoon Lake Ojibway Nation*
- How to record sound/video/still pictures
- How to write a good news print story
- How to create a good radio news story
- Selling stories to big media outlets as a freelancer
- Starting a podcast
- How to get the most out of an interview

Journalism is about keeping people connected and informed. Anything could be a story: someone's first hunting trip, the local tree nursery celebrates a huge achievement, band meetings, everything that's going on in your community. But stories need storytellers. This could be a great opportunity for you!
