Summary: Wabigoon Lake Ojibway Nation's (WLO) Environmental Team provides ongoing training and collection of data for the WLO Traditional Territory. The Environmental Lead will further develop the Environmental Team to become a sustainable foundation that supports learning and monitoring with standards based on traditional knowledge while respecting the land, thus allowing WLO to be responsible care-takers of our land as a whole.

Duties:

- Develop action plans and environmental strategic directions to fulfill WLO's environmental vision.
- Program development with community input by engaging various community members and groups.
- Provide leadership in awareness and implementation of environmental practices to achieve environmental stewardship and regulatory compliance.
- Lead all aspects of the Environmental Team.
- Ensuring the harmonization of traditional knowledge and science.
- Supporting the transfer of knowledge to younger generations.
- Monitoring various projects to ensure adherence to WLO standards.
- Lead the development and implementation of WLO's environmental compliance systems to track and demonstrate compliance with environmental and regulatory commitments and conditions.
- Liaise with various proponents and others to meet environmental and regulatory commitments and conditions for various projects within WLO's Traditional Territory.
- Provide training, mentorship, and management of the environmental team.
- Maintaining environmental management information systems/data.
- Attend staff meetings as required or requested.
- Attend any required pre-employment training and ongoing training as requested by the Director of Lands and Resources and/or Human Resources.
- Other relevant job duties as assigned by the Director of Lands and Resources.

Qualifications:

- A post-secondary degree or diploma in Environmental Science or similar field.
- Minimum of 5 years' industry experience in areas such as ecology, geoscience, and/or water science.
- Experience with environmental impact assessments and environmental compliance management.
- Possess strong knowledge of Ontario regulations and permitting requirements.
- Experience in leadership and managing staff with various capabilities and expertise.
- Advanced knowledge of environmental education strategies, permitting requirements, and regulatory compliance systems.
- Knowledge of environmental best practices, management systems, and monitoring requirements for all types of construction projects.
- Must possess a valid G Class driver's license.
- Must be highly motivated, have strong work ethic, and be detail-oriented.
- Must be reliable, punctual, and able to meet strict deadlines.
- Must possess excellent interpersonal and communication skills, both written and verbal.
- Knowledge of the Anishinaabe culture and traditions and Wabigoon Lake and the surrounding areas is an asset.
- A Wabigoon Lake Ojibway Nation Band member an asset.
- Must be willing to submit to workplace drug testing.
