Summary: Wabigoon Lake Ojibway Nation (WLOn)'s Environment Team collects data and conducts environmental monitoring for the WLOn Traditional Territory. Under the direction of the Environmental Lead, Environmental Technicians will be provided with ongoing training opportunities in project planning, sampling techniques, data management, analysis, and reporting. The Environment Team values traditional knowledge and aims to incorporate these teachings, along with scientific knowledge, into the operation of our consulting firm. The team is growing and open to hiring Environmental Technicians in Junior, Intermediate, and Senior roles based on experience and qualifications.

Duties:

- Assist the Environmental Lead in designing and implementing environmental studies for Wabigoon Lake Ojibway Nation's Traditional Territory.
- Accompany the Environmental Lead, other technicians, or other environmental teams in the field to support environmental baseline studies.
- Collaborate with internal WLOn departments and participate in identifying and mitigating potential environmental risks posed to WLOn from various projects within our Traditional Territory.
- Perform work relating to unique projects in aquatic and terrestrial (land-based) ecosystems, with a focus on conservation and management of natural resources.
- Perform physically demanding work outdoors, including loading and unloading of equipment and materials.
- Perform duties in inclement weather, such as rain, snow, and extreme temperatures.
- Help with basic maintenance of vehicles and equipment (e.g., cleaning and inventory).
- Maintain thorough and legible field notes on each program.
- Perform administrative tasks in office such as data management, data analysis, and report writing.
- Monitor activity of subcontractors working in the field in WLOn's Traditional Territory.
- Attend staff meetings as required or requested.
- Attend any required pre-employment training and ongoing training as requested by the Environmental Lead and/or Human Resources.
- Other relevant job duties as assigned by the Environmental Lead.

Qualifications:

- Completion of Grade 12 diploma/G.E.D. or equivalent.
- Post-secondary education (degree or diploma) in natural sciences (environmental science, environmental technology, earth science, environmental monitor) or related field an asset.
- Knowledge of Anishinaabe culture and traditions, as well as local and surrounding areas, an asset.
- Possession of a valid G Class driver's license an asset.
- Mechanical knowledge and experience an asset.
- Able and willing to travel as necessary or required, as well as work any required overtime.
- Must be willing to operate a canoe, boat, ATV, snowmobile, and work on or near open water.
- Must have a safety-conscious attitude and adhere to WLOn health & safety policies.
- Must be a dependable team player who is able to collaborate and communicate well with others.
- Must be self-motivated and willing to take initiative to complete tasks and meet deadlines.
- Ability to work well independently with minimal supervision.
- Must be flexible and able to adapt to changing work plans and scheduling.
- Knowledge of computers and computer software, such as Microsoft Office (Outlook, Word, Excel, PowerPoint).
- Must be able to submit to workplace drug testing.
